

AZ DOT, AZ Innovative Project Award

Portable and Removable Traffic Control Trailer Module

Prior to traffic control trailer modules being created, a contractor or unit staff had to load and off load traffic devices each time a road closure was needed or requested. The barricades, light and signs were all in separate locations. Once the traffic control trailer module was designed, various electrical equipment, including power, control box switches, and lights, inside the work area was needed to function properly, as well as a mounting system to secure the module to the trailer.

The Arizona DOT's innovation was a Traffic Control Trailer Module, an all-in-one removable unit. All items can stay on the trailer when being moved, and the module can be removed if the trailer is needed to haul equipment. The traffic control trailer is versatile, allowing it to be utilized for many closures. The barricades can be picked up quicker so traffic can return to normal operations, thus reducing the possibility of secondary accidents. This innovation improves safety, time, and money.

Mobile Application Paves the Way to Efficiency

Mohave County is the 5th largest county in the United States. They needed a solution for completing annual inspections of 994 maintained culverts not included in the National Bridge Inventory, across 2,095 maintained road miles. This was a pretty huge effort that required a system to maintain geospatial inventory, document culvert characteristics, rate culvert condition, enable image capture and timestamp and archive inspection findings in a central location, in real time and electronically. Mohave County officials came up with the idea to look towards technology and develop a mobile application.

The<u>RuralOpportunitiestoUseTransportationforEconomic</u> <u>Success</u> (ROUTES) Initiative prioritizes the needs of rural America by supporting rural transportation policy and equitable access for rural and Tribal communities that face challenges relating to transportation safety, mobility, and economic development. The ROUTES Initiative addresses disparities in rural transportation infrastructure by developing user-friendly tools and information, aggregating DOT resources, and providing direct technical assistance to better connect rural communities with the funding, financing, and outreach resources available.

Governor's Office of Highway Safety grants help ADOT promote safe commercial travel

PHOENIX – Two grants from the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety will help Arizona Department of Transportation Enforcement and Compliance Division (ECD) officers promote safe commercial travel on state highways.

The Governor's Office of Highway Safety awarded ECD \$36,654 for DUI enforcement overtime reimbursement and to purchase 10 portable alcohol breath-testing devices. The former will help ECD officers participate in multi-agency commercial vehicle DUI enforcement around major holidays and events. Being able to test for intoxication at commercial ports of entry will reduce the need for ECD officers to call on area law enforcement agencies when enforcing laws related to commercial vehicles. The safety analysis process, as part of the FHWA Safety Toolkit, is a systematic process for identifying the factors that can contribute to crashes and implementing effective countermeasures. It is a best practice method that is flexible and can be used to fit your needs. This two hour training will cover the seven step process and discuss how it can be applied using two different complementary analysis methods: the traditional site safety analysis and the systemic analysis.
